WHY JOIN THE ALLOTMENTS ASSOCIATION WHEN I DON'T HAVE AN ALLOTMENT?

The Capel St Mary Allotments Association run a shop (The Hut) selling 100's of garden consumables at discounted prices to its members, and you don't need to hold an allotment plot. For example:

- Multi-purpose compost (60 litres) @ £6 (28% cheaper than some garden centres)
- Lawn weed, feed and moss-killer 20kg @ £35.60 (8% cheaper. Also available in 5kg bags)
- Slug pellets 800g @ £3 (one third of price of typical garden centre price)
- 8' bamboo cane, £3.50 for five (30% cheaper than other suppliers)
- Rock salt for dishwashers 25kg @ £8.50 (27% cheaper than some suppliers)

You can shop at The Hut in Pound Lane every Saturday from February to October and Sundays in April, May and June.

Opening hours are 10am to noon. Membership costs £5 and can be arranged through the website, or upon your first visit to the Hut.

Free local delivery can be arranged for larger orders.
